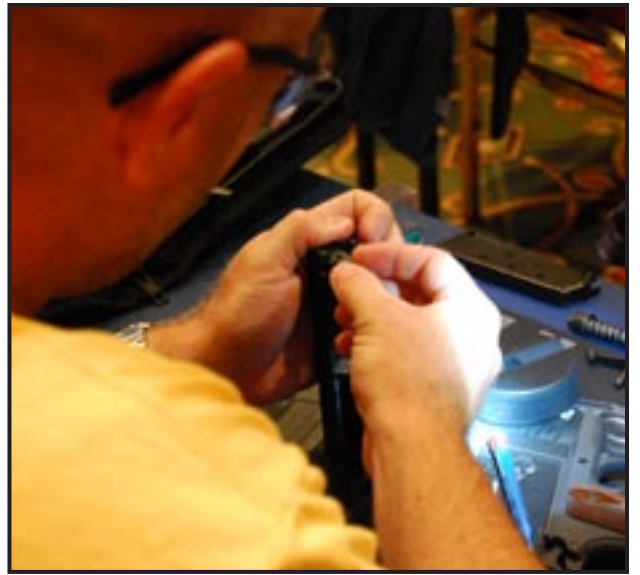

Support Equipment Requirements...

IALEFI® will have a limited amount of ammunition available for sale at the ATC. However, you should plan to bring or ship sufficient ammunition for your participation in revolver, auto-pistol, shotgun, long gun, and sub-machine gun training courses. **The exact course equipment requirements are listed following each course description!** Also, **only**

the use of frangible ammunition will be allowed to participate in any range activity that requires steel targets.

Mandatory Equipment...

All range activities require the wearing of a baseball type hat with a brim, **wrap around eye protection** with side panels, and full hard ear muff protection. Soft insertable ear protection can be used in conjunction with the hard muffs, but not in lieu of them.

Attention Texas Law Enforcement Members... TCLEOSE Credits!

All ATC attending Texas Law Enforcement Officers will be credited for 40 hours of training through the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education (TCLEOSE).

Attending International Members...

Steel Body Silhouette targets will be used and three classifications of shooters will participate according to age, and there will be a maximum of 120 participants. You will need to bring your own duty

firearm, 50 rounds of frangible ammunition, if available, and support gear. Your holster must be a Duty rig or Concealed rig with jacket. Again, whereas the match will **run according to age bracket, make sure you indicate your age on the registration.**

Spouse Activities...

One Handed Combat Shooting Course

Cliff Alves
Gloucester, Massachusetts, Police Department

This course is to give Training Officers the familiarization to shot and teach off handed and one handed drills in unconventional positions adding stress the stress of being down but not out of the fight. Due to the unconventional nature of the techniques presented in this course, the range will be run as a COLD range. All drills will initially be performed dry fire, to allow students to gain a feel for the techniques prior to performing them live fire. This will also allow students to become familiar with the inverted or sideways sight pictures they will utilize when firing from the supine and fetal positions. Additionally, all drills will be run in two relays. This will allow each student to have another student acting as an instructor/coach, to watch for any safety violations.

Student Requirements: Handgun with duty gear with 200 rounds of FMJ and 100 rounds of frangible ammunition and soft body armor.

Firearms Training for Active Threat Response

Don Alves
National Rifle Association

This course is designed to assist the instructor in developing officers' firearms skills and knowledge important for Active Threat Response. A brief overview of recent incidents and current tactics is provided. Emphasis is on live-fire exercises involving pivots, shooting on the move, close-range precision target engagement, shooting and communicating, weapons transitions, and working angles and doors. Team tactics are included. The ability to demonstrate and teach these skills safely is stressed.

Student Requirements: Handgun and duty gear with 25 rounds of ammunition, Rifle with 150 rounds of ammunition, If a patrol rifle is not available to the student, he/she may use a handgun only, in which case 175 handgun rounds will be required. Body armor is strongly encouraged but not mandatory.

SPEAR System and Combat Focus Shooting Application

Tony Blauer – Rob Pincus
BTS USA/ICE

Course focuses on SPEAR System conversion of startle flinch responses and scientifically researched skills to facilitate the officers' ability to get to their firearm and methods and drills to develop counter Ambush Shooting Skills using the Combat Focus Shooting program. Subjects include discussion on the human as a weapon system, converting the Startle-flinch into protective response and SPEAR Tactics for clear-

ing bystanders, moving through crowds, Weapon Protection vs. Weapon Retention, Defensive Shooting Fundamentals, Balance of Speed & Precision Principles and drills, and Intuitive Skill Development Methods.

Student Requirements: Handgun and duty gear with 400 rounds of ammunition

Teaching Patrol Shotgun

Charles Bottger
Jupiter, Florida, Police Department (Retired)

Course is designed to give insight into techniques and training methods instructors can use in the teaching of the patrol shotgun (both pump and semi auto) to beginning and advanced students. Focus will be to acquaint participants with the training necessary to give officers the ability to efficiently deploy the shotgun in a combat environment, including weapon manipulation, tactics, shot patterns and wound ballistics. Input by all participants will be encouraged enabling all to learn from each others experiences.

Student Requirements: Handgun and duty gear with 25 rounds of ammunition, patrol shotgun, pump or semi auto with sling and 100 rounds of OO Buck, and 50 rounds of slugs.

B.U.G. Art: Backup Gun Strategies for the L.E. Professional

NJ Division of Fish & Wildlife, Bureau of Law Enforcement (Retired)

In a lethal encounter, ready access to a backup gun can mean the difference between life and death. Officers may fall victim to a disarm and even the best handguns can suffer a catastrophic failure or otherwise be disabled. Going to Plan B and continuing to fight gives an officer the means to prevail against overwhelming odds. Many officers routinely carry a backup but few train under realistic conditions. This course will examine the viability of the backup gun for the law enforcement professional. Actual case histories, B.U.G. policy and equipment selection will be covered. Live fire drills will include drawing and firing the backup with either hand while maintaining control of the primary handgun.

Student Requirements: Handgun and duty gear and 25 rounds of ammunition, 150 rounds for back-up gun. Service pistol plus backup gun. Ideally, the backup should be small frame revolver or pocket pistol that could be discreetly hidden on duty. Larger handguns may be utilized in an appropriate holster.

NOTE: IALEFI Corporate Sponsor Sturm, Ruger & Co., Inc. will be providing a limited number of .38 Special LCR revolvers to use in this class.



RANGE COURSES & HOTEL COURSES

NRA LEAD's Begged, Borrowed, and Stolen - 2009

Each year, the NRA LEAD staff rubs shoulders with some of the best firearms instructors in the country and we take note of the very best firearms drills we see. This class highlights 4 of the best drills we have seen in the past few years. Each drill has a different individual concept, but all four are creative, fun and easy to recreate back at your agency. (These particular drills were also shown at the last ATC, but classes were rained out.)

Student Requirements: Handgun, duty gear, 200 rounds of ammunition, rifle with 30 rounds of ammunition. NOTE: Rifle is optional for one of the drills.

The 1911 Pistol: Welcome Back!

George Clay – Ron Council
Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, Police Department

The 1911 pistol is once again moving into the Law Enforcement ranks. This weapon has recently gained great popularity with special operations teams. This pistol may not be the right choice for all Law Enforcement Officers, but it does have its place in our agencies. This course has been developed to address several aspects of pistol shooting with the 1911 pistol. We will employ a series of drills. We will look at the speed with which a magazine reload should be accomplished. The speed of the draw will be explored. Off hand shooting will be experienced. A method of cover drill will be practiced. The intent of this course is to make each student a more proficient handler of the 1911 pistol.

Student Requirements: Handgun (.45) and duty gear, at least 6 magazines, and 200 rounds of ammunition.



Response to Ambiguous Close Threats (ReACT) Position

Lon Bartel
Peoria, Arizona, Police Department

This course is designed to shape the startle response into a motor program that provides officers with a response that allows for a quick transition from hands on or lethal force depending on the threat presented. Many times a close proximity threat will be presented and it is not immediately obvious what the threat level is. The wrong decision on a force option could make the situation more dangerous for the officer and nearby citizens (i.e. accessing duty weapon when hand on is needed). The ReACT position allows for a rapid transition to either deadly force or hands on with minimal risk of an improper choice and the consequences that could occur.

Student Requirements: None.

Justifying Your Firearms and Training Programs

Students will discover case law, how it dictates task related training and be provided examples of how to document and justify their firearms and training programs. This course material will apply equally to small and large organizations.

Student Requirements: None.

SWAT to the Streets

Liam Duggan

The skills and ideas taught to SWAT/Special Ops teams are sometimes seen as too "specialized" to be used by patrol or general personnel. This course is for instructors who want to "teach to the 10's" and encourage the offensive mindset and skills in ALL of their personnel. Through classroom, demonstration and roundtable, attendees will walk away with teachable ideas in movement, target ID, weapons handling and cognitive concepts that EVERY officer needs to know.

Student Requirements: None

Gun Arm Grappling

W. Hock Hochheim
Denton, Texas, Police Department (Retired)

There are six common stopping points - the Stop Six" - to a one-on-one or one-versus two confrontations and arrest. During any one of these "collisions" or stopping points, guns can be drawn by the officer and the suspect. This course covers situational and positional problem-solving from standing to ground. Replica pistols, air soft and even

rubber band guns will be used to demonstrate lines of fire and the success or failure of the exercises. The course includes pistol disarming and retention.

Student Requirements: Duty belt, expandable or duty carry baton. Eye protection, duty clothes or similar. No sweat pants, but real street pants.

Beretta Model PX4 Pistol Armorer's Course (8 Hours)

C.R. Vanderscoff III – Len Lucas
Beretta USA Corporation

This eight hour course will provide armorer certification in the Beretta Model PX4 Series Pistol.

Student Requirements: None.

DS Arms FAL SA58 Rifle Armorer's Course

Mike Keefe – Dan Lombard
Spartan Tactical Training Group, LLC

This DS Arms – Law Enforcement Training Division armorers course is specifically designed for current and prospective department armorers involved in field repair and maintenance of the DS Arms FAL SA58 rifle. This hands on course provides the student with detailed information covering nomenclature, cycle of operation, basic and detailed disassembly & reassembly function checking, troubleshooting, basic field repair and preventive maintenance. Upon completion of this course, the student will receive a DS Arms FAL SA58 armorer's certification valid for (3) years.

Student Requirements: All rifles, tools and armorer manuals for this class are provided by DS Arms. Students will need eye protection, note pad and pen. Eye protection is mandatory!

Glock Armorer's Course (8 Hours)

Upon completion of this eight hour course the participant will receive a three year armorer certification from the manufacturer.

Student Requirements: None.

Comprehensive AR-15/M-16 Armorer's Course (24 Hours)

This is not your everyday Armorer's Course. This course will teach you to fully assemble and disassemble an AR-15/M-16 rifle including new/replacement barrels, sights, stocks, and hand-guards. It will also teach you to troubleshoot the weapon and why it is not operating correctly. This is a very intense three (3) day course with hands on operation. This course is restricted to current law enforcement officers.

Student Requirements: None.

DSS Handgun Skills Test

Shawn Claussen

City of Bettendorf, Iowa, Police Department

The DSS Handgun Skills Test is designed to allow an instructor to evaluate an officer's already established handgun skills set in a continuous drill while using their entire duty load out. The test is shot in 3 stages: Weapon Hand Only, Support Hand Only and Shooting Platform. The skill sets that are covered include: trigger manipulation and front sight tracking, proper use of cover, malfunction clearance, one-handed weapon manipulation, positional shooting, and multiple targets.

Student Requirements: Handgun and duty gear with 200 rounds of ammunition and at least three magazines.

Scoped Patrol Rifle, "What a Concept"

Ron Council - George Clay

Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, Police Department

There is a growing trend among the criminal element toward the adoption of semi-automatic and automatic weaponry. A subject armed with a high capacity rifle can terrorize an entire community, causing mass fatalities and secondary injuries. This can be illustrated by the Narco Bank robbery, the San Ysindro Shooting, the Miami F.B.I. Shooting and the Palm Bay Shooting. The increasing number of active shooters in schools and the increase in officers being shot with rifles has also lead to the need for Law Enforcement to be armed with superior firepower. This course is not intended to provide sniper training, but to provide training and qualification to those participating in order to provide this option to our officers that may encounter tactical situations requiring a reaction beyond the parameters of our issued side arms, shotguns and basic patrol rifles. This Scoped Patrol Rifle Course is designed to provide officers at the patrol level with a comprehensive sixteen hour course that will qualify them to be proficient with the scoped patrol rifle. Upon completion of the course the patrol officer will have the ability and confidence to effectively deploy the Rifle with 80 rounds of ammunition.

Student Requirements: Scoped patrol rifle with sling and 60 rounds of ammunition.

Handgun Shooting Precision

Santa Barbara, California, Sheriff's Department

To refresh "active shooter" and suicide bomber skills/tactics and force shooter to operate calmly under stressful conditions with an appreciation of handgun caliber performance versus anatomical ballistic performance.

Student Requirements: Handgun and duty gear with 50 rounds of ammunition.

DS Arms FAL SA58 Rifle Operator Course

John Krupa III - Vince Jamison

Spartan Tactical Training Group, LLC

This DS Arms - Law Enforcement Training Division 4-hour training block focuses on development of operator skills that are necessary to safely deploy the DS Arms FAL SA58 rifle during tactical operations and personal defense deployment. The student will be familiarized with nomenclature, method of operation, gas regulator adjustment, loading / unloading and reloading, malfunction clearance drills, combat gun-handling skills, presentation from low ready, combat ready and indoor ready positions, CQB applications and much more.

Student Requirements: 150 rounds of new manufacture .308 FMJ rifle ammunition. DS Arms will provide all FAL SA58 rifles, magazines and slings for this course.

Developing Combat Speed and Accuracy

Bend, Oregon, Police Department

Michael Hatoor, Larry Prince

Due to the short duration and quick time-frame of law enforcement gunfights, officers must be trained to draw and present their weapons in a condensed period of time. This class provides some dry-fire drills to help provide a solid base of knowledge and skill. Using the foundation established by the dry fire drills, effective live-fire drills are introduced to maximize and test our ability to deliver shots with combat speed and accuracy.

Student Requirements: Handgun and duty gear with 100 rounds of ammunition.

Precision Pistol - Back to the Basics

Jeff Hall - Mark Peters

NRA LEAD

We have sacrificed accuracy on the altar of "firepower". We are training too many students to rely on the capacity of the magazine rather than better marksmanship. We have gone from 2.5 rounds fired per office per engagement to 12.8 rounds; in an age of liability, where we must account for each round fired, its time to return to and emphasize fundamentals and improve accuracy in ourselves and in our students. Only after any shooter masters the fundamentals can he progress to "tactical" this and "advanced" that. This program will teach instructors a series of precision shooting drills that will emphasize the fundamentals of marksmanship- stance, balance, sight alignment, sight picture, trigger press, follow-through, and breathing. These drills will be fired from 3 to 60 yards (range permitting) with one hand and with standard two-handed stances.

Student Requirements: Handgun and duty gear with 200 rounds of ammunition.
