Reduced Light Rifle (Optional Evening Program) *Instructor: Mike Boyle*

History illustrates that most police action shootings occur under reduced light conditions. Less than optimum light conditions play havoc with a law enforcement officers ability to locate, assess and if necessary react to potentially lethal danger. One way of leveling the playing field is to utilize a shoulder weapon. Of late rifles have been encroaching on turf that has been traditionally dominated by the shotgun. This block of instruction will address use of the rifle in reduced light conditions. Human performance, equipment selection and training recommendations will be covered. A number of challenging live fire drills will also be offered. This is an optional evening program offered to all attendees.

Mike Boyle served as a Captain with the New Jersey Division of Fish & Wildlife, Bureau of Law Enforcement. He remains active as a police academy instructor and is the author of over 400 articles on police training, tactics and equipment. Mike has served on the IALEFI Board of Directors since 1996.

Student Requirements: Rifle or pistol caliber carbines, 3 magazines and 150 rounds. Gun mounted or hand held light. Pistol with 20 rounds.

Shotgun: The King is Dead, Long Live the King!

Instructors: Dr. Rocco Mazza & Michael Kane

Objectives: Utilization of the shotgun is a defining characteristic of the American Military and it has done yeomen service from Chapultepec to Fallujah. It is only natural that law enforcement would embrace the "scattergun". The question is now asked...after the North Hollywood shootout, has the veteran of the OK Corral outlived its usefulness or have we trained to fail?

Dr. Mazza has served with both the Edison Police Dept. and the Middlesex County Prosecutors Office. During his 35 year law enforcement career he has had a wide range of assignments including SWAT team commander and county range master. Rocco holds numerous firearms certifications from the FBI, Smith & Wesson, F.L.E.T.C. and H&K, and has instructed at several colleges.

Michael Kane is a 25 year law enforcement veteran and is an instructor in multiple firearms disciplines. He is a competitive shooter, gunsmith and was the lead investigator on the Attorney General's Shooting Response Team.

Student Requirements: Shotgun, 75 rounds birdshot, 20 rounds buckshot, 20 rifle slugs.

Obtaining the Proper Tactical Mindset Prior to Critical Incidents

The final weapon remains the brain. In the face of adversity even the best tactics, skill and equipment are useless without the proper mindset. This course will explore a number of factors as the relate to mental conditioning including body alarm reaction, stress response, and neural path learning.

Don Smith has been with the Palm Bay Florida Police Dept. for 27 years and currently serves as a Sergeant. Don has over 2,000 hours of SWAT and firearms certifications and instructs in all areas of police use of force. He is highly regarded as a rifle instructor and was a member of the USMCR National Squad Shooting Team. Don currently serves on the IALEFI Board of Directors.

Prevailing in Violent Street Encounters

Instructor: Professor David James

Law Enforcement officers are now challenged by an even more violent criminal element. While threats from knives and firearms are legitimate concerns, empty hand assaults are far more common. Unchecked, an empty hand assault could prove lethal. In a spontaneous assault, there is simply no guarantee that there will be time to access a baton or chemical weapon. How good are your defensive skills? This block of instruction will provide the student with some basic strategies and skills to effectively counter high levels of resistance.



Prevailing in Violent Street Encounters continued:
Instructor Professor David James is the creator of 1-2-3 Hit, an innovative program that utilizes a wide range of effective empty hand techniques to counter what actually happens on the street. In 1993 David was voted "Instructor of the Year" and inducted into the Martial Arts Hall of Fame. He is currently the Chief Instructor of Vee Arnis Jitsu located in Brooklyn, New York.

Off Duty Mindset / Off Duty Carry Options

Instructor: Lt. Ron King

Through discussion and live fire drills, students will determine what their off duty needs are, and the options of lethal and less lethal tools available to them. Discrete carry, deep concealment and off body carry will be addressed. Each student will consider options such as pistol, shoulder weapons, knives, chemical sprays, impact weapons and electroshock weapons. At the conclusion of the training each student will demonstrate the ability to draw from a variety of concealed carry options and effectively engage targets at realistic distances.

Lt. Ron King served 22 years with the Melbourne Florida Police Dept. During his career Lt. King served in patrol, narcotics, training and SWAT he also served 3 years as he lead firearms instructor at the local police academy. He now works as a factory representative for a major manufacturer of police and military body armor.

Student Requirements: Pistol w/concealable holster, extra magazines, 100 rounds of ammunition, shirt, jacket or vest for concealment. Optional equipment chemical spray, impact weapon fanny pack or go bag (aka Jack Bauer bag).
