Certification Overview

The International Association of Law Enforcement Firearms Instructors (IALEFI®) is pleased to present the **Firearms Instructor Course**. Instructor Certification will be given upon the successful completion of this 44 hour course.

Students will develop and present a briefing of a court case.

Students will develop a lesson plan and a course of fire from instructional objectives. They will then present the lesson in the classroom and the course of fire on the range.

Students will select an officer involved shooting incident that has occurred in their agency or area. They will develop a course of fire to address the lessons learned from the incident chosen and present it on the range.

Students not teaching will coach other students during range exercises under the direction of the instructor cadre.

Marksmanship and Tactical Courses include shooting drills, bulls-eye, qualification courses, tactical courses, shooting on the move, low-light shooting, close combat, shoot-don't shoot, loading and reloading drills, and stoppage drills

Students must fire at or above an average score of 85% throughout the program. This course is a highly interactive combination of classroom and range sessions.

Orientation and Course Overview.

All students will complete the following requirements:

A 90% Qualification with a semi-automatic pistol

Equipment Required:

Semi-Automatic Pistol with at least 3 magazines, duty holster and magazine pouches, 1000 rounds duty or practice factory ammunition for pistol, cleaning materials for firearms, ear protection (muff type preferable), eye protection (safety glasses) with side protection, billed cap (required for protection from flying cases), flashlight (with extra batteries), stopwatch (mechanical or electronic), and a whistle. A lap top / tablet or some electronic aid device is strongly recommended, along with a thumb drive.

Attire, will be appropriate to the weather conditions and rain gear should be available. Remember, the professional appearance of an instructor is of the utmost importance.



Entry Level Qualifications for the Course

Completion of state, federal, military or civilian security or law-enforcement-oriented live fire firearms training of at least 32 hours in length.

Law Enforcement Officers must have successful completion of field training and agency probation.

Private security applicants must provide documentation of actual employment and experience in an armed security of criminal justice system capacity, including but not limited to corporate, industrial or retail security, licensed private investigation, executive protection, armored transport, corrections, or comparable employment.

Successful completion of a basic instructor program, law enforcement or military instructor program, or a civilian equivalent, of at least 32 hours in length. Acceptable programs include general topics instructor, adult learning instructor, and methods of instruction courses. Students who have undergraduate or graduate degree in education or teaching are also eligible. IALEFI® retains the right to request further information and/or documentation from students to determine eligibility. At IALEFI® discretion, persons without such training may be accepted to attend but they are forewarned that their ability to pass this course is greatly reduced.

Successful completion of a handgun course of fire with a score of 90% or greater.

Possess all the equipment and materials required to participate in the course.
