## TUE 4 Hr Marjorie Stoneman Douglas School Shooting (Wakefield B) (Wakefield B)



Speaker: Scott Myers Bio

The student will learn about several of the tactical considerations law enforcement faced when dealing with a mass shooting at a high school. The course will focus on training, mindset, tactics, tools, first aid, aftermath and lessons learned.

Sergeant Scott Myers was one of the first officers to arrive on scene of one of the nations most deadly shootings. He was part of the first team of officers to enter the school in an attempt to neutralize the killer. He transitioned into a rescue/recovery team and eventually assisted with the apprehension of the killer.

Officer Scott Levin was one of the first K9 officers to arrive on scene. He assisted with

clearing large areas of the campus and assisted with securing and protecting civilians at the school.

The course is broken down into three sections. The first element is background information and pre-incident. The second section deals with the actual incident and tactical response. The final part is an overview of what went good and what could be improved. The overall focus of the course is to provide critical information to other agencies to improve their response to a potential mass killing.

### **WED 4 Hr The Training Triangle (Wakefield B) (Wakefield B)**

Today's LEOs face a greater challenge than ever in our history as we attempt to do our jobs in an environment filled with cell phone cameras in every direction and many people ready and willing to serve as instant judge and jury in an officer involved use of force incident.

In order to train officers in use of force issues, we must be able to train on the mechanics of the weapons but also train when to use them and when to use other means. This involves the training triangle. The classroom, range and simulator form three points of the triangle that is crucial to developing a complete training opportunity.

This course will cover the use of each of these facilities, the best practices, and the shortfalls of each that are made up by the others, to help firearms instructors better prepare officers to use their tools and when.

To utilize a multi-faceted environment to train LEOs in marksmanship, decision making and general firearms handling and proficiency. The course explores the use of the classroom, range and simulator environments as a combined set of instructional tools.

### **Friday October 15 - Contemporary Legal and Training Issues for Firearms Instructors**

## Contemporary Legal and Training Issues for Firearms Instructors

Course attendees will understand:

- the significance and influence firearms instructors have over their students and how their training influences officers behavior on the street
- how to analyze an incident to determine root cause issues involved in the officers actions taken during the incident
- use the results of such an analysis to establish future training objectives and goals
- understand the importance of interleaving various skills into training to improve trainee skill retention and maximize available training time
- understand the potential impact of how an officer explains a use of force incident

Firearms instructors typically provide the most direct training that officers will receive in their careers. This role must be taken seriously and instructors need to understand the significance of this and seek ways to constantly improve and enhance their training, with the goal of maximizing the impact of available training time. Course content will include:

- an explanation of the importance of reviewing tragic incidents or "near misses" to determine whether there are root cause issues that should be addressed in future training
- a review of videos of incidents and discussion of what training issues are presented
- a discussion of the importance of interleaving of skills and incorporating more than traditional firearms drills and skills
- an overview of the concept of priority of life and the reality of human performance under high emotional stress
- a discussion of the importance of reality based training with suggestions of certain principles that should be incorporated, such as the impact of priming on an officers response and the importance of building an understanding the importance of discretionary time
- an overview of important principles concerning how officers explain a use of force and the danger of robotic statements and/or the framing of testimony.

#### Hall of U.S. Arms

The Hall of U.S. Arms contains many prototype firearms and some of the earliest designs in U.S. weaponry. Consisting of pistols, rifles, and a number of martially marked canons. It features one of the largest Gatling gun collections found in North America. A timeline of U.S. uniforms is also on display showing the progression from the wool uniform of our nation's first military members to current camouflage patterns and modern materials worn by troops of today.

#### Hall of Modern Arms

The Hall of Modern Arms features firearms from Armalite, Cadillac Gage, Colt, and many others. The hall focuses on designers and manufacturers from around the world, to create a one of a kind collection.

A Memorial Gallery is located in this hall, dedicated to Mr. Eugene Stoner. It displays his drafting desk, original hand drawn AR-10 design, the M8 prototype, his prototype "garage guns" as well as several #1 serial numbers from their production runs. The firearms and designs in the Stoner room have been preserved to honor his ground breaking work and legacy in small arms design.

#### Hall of Armor

The Hall of Armor houses vehicles and armor from WWI, WWII, Korea, Vietnam, and the Iraq era. The Hall has light, medium, and main battle tanks. Many of these tanks have been restored to factory specs – ground up restorations, done by IMT's Tankshop.

The context for this class will be defending from inside a vehicle when ambushed.

This 4 hour introduction to the 360 CQD method will be broken down into two, 2 hour blocks.

The first 2 hours will be in classroom where you will learn and perform the technique of 360 CQD utilizing inert training pistols.

The second 2 hours will be on the range where you will learn the 360 CQD firing positions, including firing from a seated position with aimed fire over 360 degrees.

Students will be able to demonstrate the ability to defend from a vehicle ambush coming from any direction and put aimed fire onto the threat(s) utilizing the 360 CQD technique to shoot from a stationary, seated position in a complete 360 degree arc.

Students will be able to demonstrate the 360 CQD unique weapon protection and defensive techniques to retain their pistol.

Students will gain introductory knowledge of the 360 CQD medically evidenced benefits to increase their ability to shoot in close quarter deadly force situation.

The RCMP Fatigue Management Program (FMP) is designed to provide operational and administrative employees with the knowledge, skills and strategies to effectively manage the rigors of shiftwork, on-call and extended hours of operation to improve physical and mental resilience as well as overall wellbeing. The five module course, available in both classroom format as well as online, explains the foundational science of sleep, circadian rhythms, and fatigues as it affects human performance. Subsequent modules examine the prevalence of sleep disorders, with particular attention to obstructive sleep apnea and the risk factors related to those working shift work and extended hours of operations. The course finishes up by suggesting proven approaches to minimize fatigue associated with shift work as well as how to formulate goals to improve one's overall quality of life. A recent update to the course examines the connection and consequences of sleep, fatigue and mental health, with time spent on operational stress injuries and the impact on sleep and sleep disturbances.

Participants will:

- learn and apply the basic principles of sleep and circadian rhythm science to their role

as Law Enforcement Officers who work rigorous shift schedules that directly affect health and human performance.

- be able to assess and evaluate the impact of Fatigue on behavior, performance and health in a stressful demanding occupation.
- be able to implement a Fatigue Risk Management Strategy within their organization using basic principles of engagement with senior management and front line officers.
- experience the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Fatigue Management Training Program that has been designed to train a large national law enforcement organization over an extensive geographical area to improve physical and mental health, enhance front line performance and strengthen the stability of the workforce.
- develop a clear and comprehensive understanding of Fatigue Risk Management in Law Enforcement and the evidence to support the implementation of FRMS in law enforcement organizations.

A critical study of the most undertrained and misunderstood tool carried by Law Enforcement Officers, our Duty Knife officer program is built around the above philosophy and is an exhaustive study of the tactical folder. The system provides first and foremost a template for operating in Extreme Close Quarter violent confrontations and/or grounded environments and escaping and regaining mobility. Drills and exercises emphasize key positions and maneuvers to retain or recover weapons and regain positions of advantage both on and off the mat.

This course is designed to provide officers with a deep understanding of defensive edged weapon deployment and firearm retention tactics. This course will run the police marksman through a series of critical Skills and Drills that will task the sniper to provide critical shots during a variety of circumstances.

The course will consist of classroom instruction on malfunctions, communications, anatomy and hard target interdiction. The students will transition to range training and there will be a series of live fire drills covering the topics discussed in the class room. Students will deploy at various distances utilizing hold over and dialed scope adjustments. Students carry out malfunction drills and special ammunition switch outs under a time constraint. The snipers will engage anatomical targets and properly place rounds for maximum effect. Students will perform simultaneous exercises for hostage rescue. Communication exercises will be performed during the training event. This course is intended for the operational police sniper or instructor.

The course includes a written examination and a shooting test.

The IALEFI® Firearms Instructor Course is designed to train law enforcement, military, and licensed security personnel as instructors. This 44-hour course is interactive with students directly participating in course presentations through developing and teaching segments of learning while being mentored by experienced firearms instructors.

Students attending will learn the duties and responsibilities of law enforcement firearms instructors. Students will learn methods of instruction, how to prepare, and present lesson plans. Students will learn range procedures, range commands, range safety, and range control. Students will learn how to diagnose and correct problems shooter.

Students must complete the following required exercises:

Students must research and present a classroom briefing of an adjudicated state or federal court case and in class, teach its effects on law enforcement firearms training (i.e. Popow v. City of Margate).

Students will develop a lesson plan and course of fire from numerous enforcement firearms instructional objectives. They will present that objective in the classroom and their developed course of fire on the range.
